Prior to his time at Monadnock, Hirsch served as President and Executive Director of THRIVEGulu, an international humanitarian organization supporting trauma recovery, gender equity, and economic empowerment for survivors of sexual violence in Uganda from 2017-2023. Under his leadership, the organization expanded its impact through a five-year strategic plan, modernized communications and operations, and developed culturally inclusive, evidence-based programs.

Hirsch also has extensive experience in refugee advocacy and program management. As the Refugee Program Manager for UNHCR and HAGAR International in Cambodia, he designed and implemented a nationwide humanitarian program, ensuring refugees had access to healthcare, economic self-sufficiency programs, and literacy initiatives. His work also included specialized support for survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence and advocacy for refugees' legal rights. Earlier in his career, he contributed to refugee resettlement efforts at the International Institute of New England in Lowell, coordinating housing, education, and employment programs while administering grant aid and teaching cultural orientation courses.

Mick's background also reflects a compassionate approach to community development and spiritual care. His previous experience as an oncology chaplain at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute

involved supporting patients and families navigating cancer diagnoses, contributing to interdisciplinary healthcare teams, and promoting staff well-being.

Academic Contributions and Public Engagement

Trained as a pastoral counselor at the Yale University Divinity School and later as a psychiatric chaplain at the Georgia Center for Care and Counseling and as a global mental health specialist at the Harvard Program in Refugee Trauma, Mick has focused his 23-year career on bringing hope and healing to survivors of sexual- and gender-based violence.

His holistic approach to trauma recovery is evident in his service as psychiatric chaplain at the Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Center in Hartford, CT and as Adjunct Professor in the Department of Holocaust & Genocide Studies at Keene State College. Across his work, Mick prioritizes gender equity, risk management, child protection, disability rights, and support for immigrant and refugee communities.
